I was asked to provide information concerning the amount of savings that occurred this year with the changing of the health insurance during the last negotiations. Mrs. Schetrompf was able to calculate our savings from our previous health insurance over what we previously had in place at \$84,622.86. We had a total of three employees except the \$2,500.00 to opt out and go on their spouses insurance.

Building and Grounds Manager

WORK IN PROGRESS:

1. The number one boiler is being removed.
2. New Boilers, circulators, expansion tanks, and water softner have arrived.
3. Mats have been cleaned to protect the gym floor.

NEXT SCHEDULED TASKS:

1. Once the boiler is removed the mechanical room will be cleaned before any new equipment is installed.

STORAGE:

Two sea containers were delivered May6, 2013. Once we get some ventilation into the containers they will be ready to use.

ITEM NEEDING ATTENTION:

The sump pump serving the mechanical room does not pump enough water fast enough. I recommend replacing pump with the proper size and rerouting the discharge lines so that the water will enter the storm drains located at the west side of the building instead of being pumped

from the 9 ft deep sump hole and being discharged through the floor of the new ag classroom back at the shops. The head height is approximately 37 ft, the old pump in the mechanical room is at least 20 years old and not designed for that amount of head. Remember, the water level in the mechanical room has reached 6" and 36" in the past few years. Cost to repair will be approximately \$800.00.
