

<p>Pol. 110</p>	<p>The Board shall maintain the program of extracurricular activities at no cost to participating students, except that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The Board's responsibility for the provisions of supplies shall carry the same exemptions as listed in the Board's policy on regular school supplies.2. Students may assume all or part of the costs of travel and attendance at extracurricular events and trips.3. Where eligibility requirements are necessary or desirable, the Board shall be informed and must approve the establishment of eligibility standards before they are operable. Specifically:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Participants must be in attendance at school for the full day on the day of an event in order to participate. A student will be considered as having been in attendance for a full day if the student has written preapproval (parent/guardian to principal) to attend a school-sponsored field trip, competition, interview for college, service, occupation admission, death in the immediate family, approved dental/doctor appointment, or other legally approved absence.b. Accumulated tardiness, unexcused or unlawful absence on the day of an extracurricular event will make the student ineligible to participate.c. Students who have been assigned to out-of-school suspension will not be allowed to participate before 12:00 midnight during the timeframe of the disciplinary action.
<p>Pol. 218</p>	<p><u>Off-Campus Activities</u></p> <p>This policy shall also apply to student conduct that occurs off school property and would otherwise violate the Code of Student Conduct if any of the following circumstances exist:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. There is a nexus between the proximity or timing of the conduct in relation to the student's attendance at school or school-sponsored activities via school district provided transportation and may apply if not using district transportation as determined on a case-by-case basis depending on the particular circumstances, including, but not limited to the proximity in time and geographic distance to the school-sponsored event.2. The student is a member of an extracurricular activity and has been notified that particular off-campus conduct could result in exclusion from such activities.

<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility 24 P.S. Sec. 5323, 5333 Pol. 123.1, 123.2</p>	<p>3. Student expression or conduct materially and substantially disrupts the operations of the school, or the administration reasonably anticipates that the expression or conduct is likely to materially and substantially disrupt the operations of the school.</p> <p>4. The conduct has a direct nexus to attendance at school or a school-sponsored activity, such as an agreement to complete a transaction outside of school that would violate the Code of Student Conduct.</p> <p>5. The conduct involves the theft or vandalism of school property.</p> <p><u>Yearbook</u></p> <p>Persons to whom the yearbook is dedicated may receive a free copy of the yearbook. Persons designated by the yearbook staff and advisor may receive a free yearbook, each case will be determined on an individual basis.</p> <p>Each school year, prior to participation in an athletic activity, every student athlete and his/her parent/guardian shall sign and return the acknowledgement or receipt and review of the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Concussion and Traumatic Brain Injury Information Sheet.2. Sudden Cardiac Arrest Symptoms and Warning Signs Information Sheet. <p>The Superintendent or designee shall develop administrative regulations to implement an extracurricular program which shall:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Assess the needs and interests of the students of this district.2. Involve students in the planning of extracurricular activities.3. Be responsive to the articulated needs of students.4. Ensure the provision of competent guidance and supervision of staff.5. Guard against the exploitation of students.6. Provide for the continuing evaluation of the extracurricular program.7. Ensure that all extracurricular activities are open to all students and that all students are fully informed of the extracurricular opportunities open to them.
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<p>20 U.S.C. Sec. 4071 et seq</p>	<p><u>Equal Access Act</u></p> <p>The district shall provide secondary students the opportunity for noncurriculum-related student groups to meet on the school premises during noninstructional time for the purpose of conducting a meeting within the limited open forum on the basis of the religious, political, philosophical, or other content of the speech at such meetings. Such meetings must be voluntary, student-initiated, and not sponsored in any way by the school, its agents or employees.</p> <p>Noninstructional time is the time set aside by the school before actual classroom instruction begins or after actual classroom instruction ends.</p> <p>The meetings of student groups cannot materially and substantially interfere with the orderly conduct of the educational activities in the school.</p> <p>The Superintendent or designee shall establish the length of sessions, number per week, and other such limitations as felt reasonably necessary.</p> <p>The district retains the authority to maintain order and discipline on school premises to protect the well-being of students and employees and to ensure that the attendance of students at such meetings is on a voluntary basis.</p> <p>References:</p> <p>School Code – 24 P.S.
